



Waders or wading boots are optional, but all gear to contact stream waters must be thoroughly cleaned and decontaminated prior to use at the field site.



Directions to field demonstration site:

Off I-5, take W Harvard for 1.5 miles and then left onto Lookingglass Road. Drive about 4 miles west to the intersection with Colonial Road, take left. Take 1st right onto Coos Bay Wagon Road.



Directions to field demonstration site (continued):

Drive west on Coos Bay Wagon Road for about 8 miles.



Burnt Mtn Road is on your right. Just past that on Coos Bay Rd is the park entrance.
